

They like things that have a short e sound.


Breakfast is their best meal.

"I like to eat bread," said Beth.


"Bread is the best."


"I think eggs are the best," said Ned.

"I like bread and eggs," said Meg.


Beth, Ned, and Meg ate bread and eggs for breakfast every day.
