 They were not for spoiled boys.

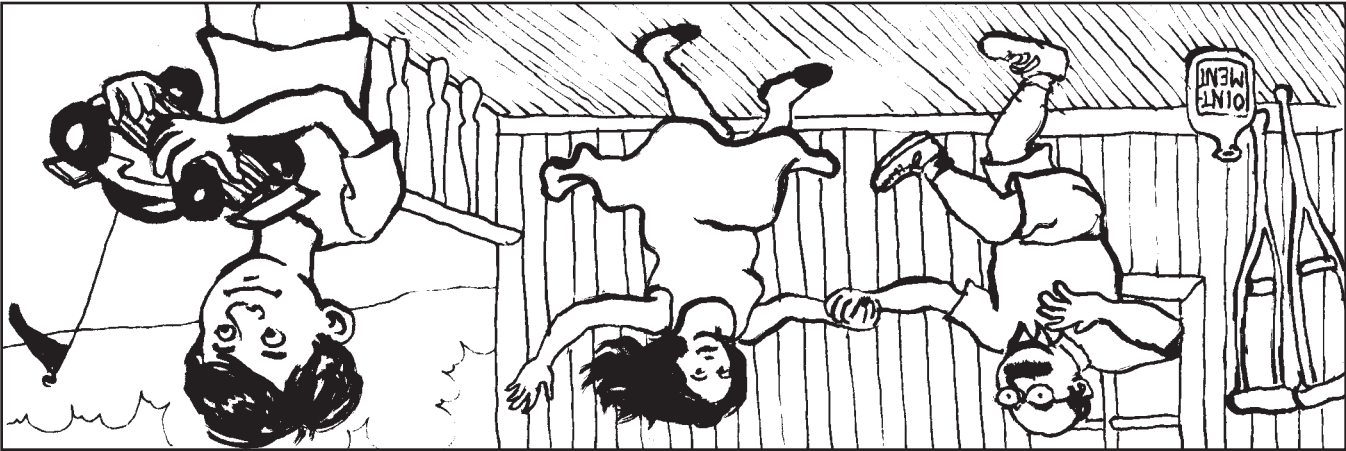


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In time, Roy's mom and dad got well.

 Roy toiled all day long.



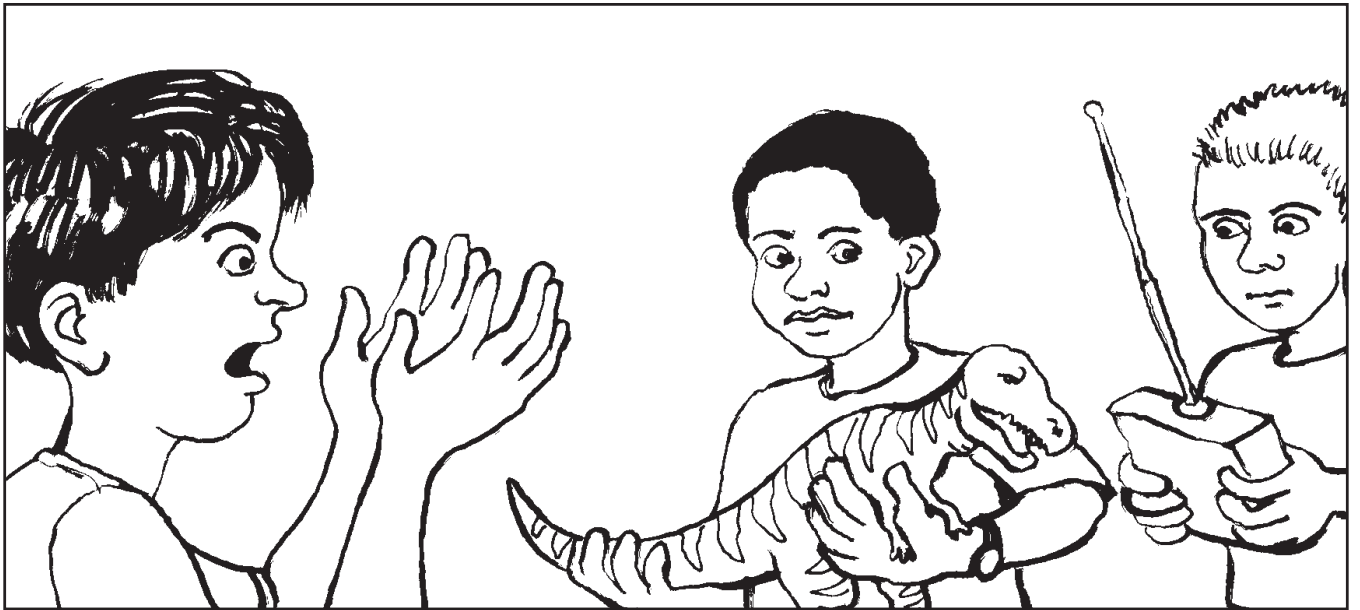
Most boys like to play with toys.

 Roy gave the coins to his mom and dad.



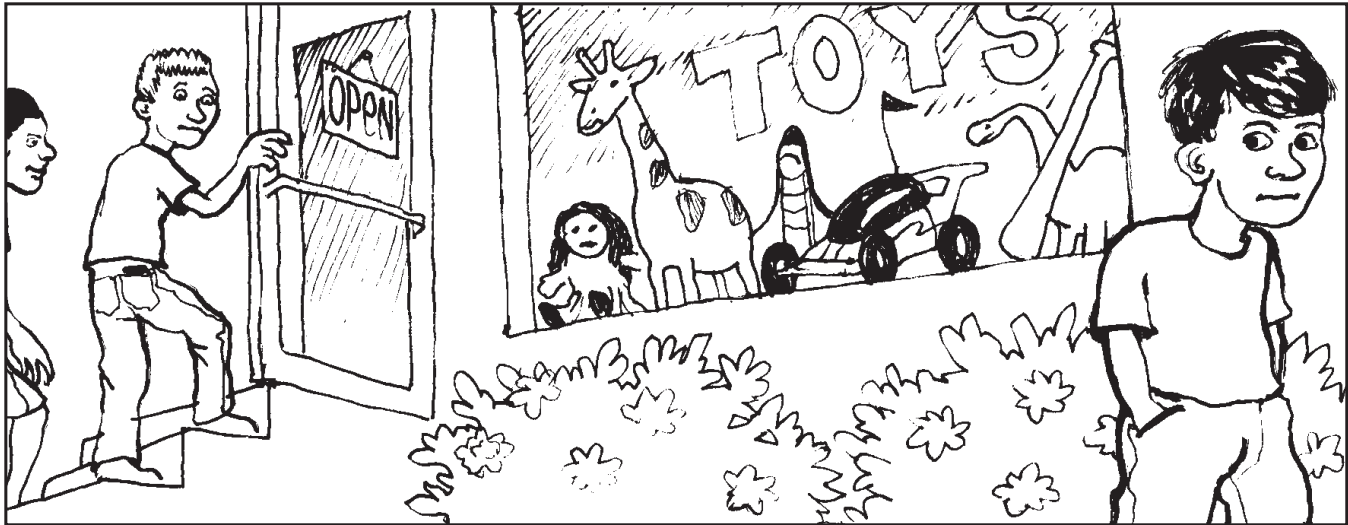
Roy thought toys made too much noise.
